2017 PIONEER OF THE YEAR

John Pedersen



John was born in Denmark but lived out most of his childhood on a dairy farm in Mission, BC. He moved to Vancouver in 1974 and has remained in the Vancouver West End since.

John started his career with Famous Players on June 1st, 1975 at the Orpheum Theatre as an assistant manager trainee. He was hired by Pioneer Ted Bielby and they are still great friends to this day. John continued his employment with Famous Players/Cineplex Entertainment for the next 38 years and held positions including Theatre Manager and General Manager at various theatres in the BC Lower-Mainland.

Throughout his career in the theatre exhibition business, John was well known for being a philanthropist. He first started supporting the Richmond Food Bank, while working at Richmond Centre, offering a monthly free movie for seniors with the donation of any food item. This program brought in totals of 20,000 lbs to 25,000 lbs of food each year and continued annually until the closure of the theatre.

In 1990, while still at Richmond Centre, John began raising funds for the AIDS Walk. The campaign expanded over the years to all the

Cineplex theatres in the lower-mainland, as well as some on Vancouver Island. The campaign continues to this day and has raised a total of approximately \$450K so far. For his work with Positive Living BC, who execute the annual Vancouver AIDS Walk, John was nominated three times for the Accolade Award in the category of Philanthropist of the Year, which he won in 2004.

John has been presented numerous other awards throughout his career including the first ever Customer Service Award sponsored by the Richmond Review newspaper, and the Volunteer of the Year and Above and Beyond the Call of Duty twice each from the Richmond Centre Mall. John also received the Volunteer of the Year award from Famous Players, the Impact award from the Cineplex BC Region and the first ever EPIC award from Cineplex Entertainment. John has been active with other charities as well, including the Kids Help Phone, WE and Starlight Children's Charity, who he continues to support.

John was a member of the Board of Directors for the Motion Picture Theatre Association of British Columbia for 23 years until he retired from Cineplex in August 2013. John was also

on the Board of Directors for the Canadian Picture Pioneers BC Chapter for 17 years, many of which he was President, and in 2003 he was the Ancillary Award Recipient. John has been very active with the Canadian Picture Pioneer Scholarship Fund, that was started by Sandra Stewart, and it is a charity that he is very passionate about. John continues to raise funds and awareness for the fund, as well as judge the applications.

Although John retired from his career in theatre exhibition, he continues to utilize his well-known guest service skills part-time with the Vancouver Canucks as a Host at Rogers Arena in Vancouver. In addition, John does part-time work on his beloved Paddlewheeler Riverboat Tours in whichever role that his 'people skills' are needed. "I've always been very much of a people person and I've always wanted to work at an arena with hockey and concerts, so it's like a dream come true. It's like crossing something off my bucket list!"

John's favourite saying has always been, "Friends are family that you choose" and he has made a huge family from all of industry friends. He is very excited to have the honour of being named Pioneer of the Year in 2017 and celebrate with all of his "family".

A career in the Canadian film industry is what I might call a 'happy accident' for me. It all started when I graduated business school and applied for a job at Famous Players based on an ad that I saw in the Toronto Star classifieds (yes, in a newspaper, for all you millennials out there). I started in 1995 as a Business Analyst – crunching numbers for Famous Players to justify building all those stadium-seated multiplexes that still largely drive the Canadian box office today.

A little over a year later the head film buyer for Famous at that time, Joe Strebinger, got tired of me pestering him for box office estimates and made me an offer I could not refuse – I was joining the Film team as a booker. Rumour had it they only worked one day a week and watched movies the rest of the time! Well those rumours were not true, yet Joe's warnings were... Mondays will be tough and you will, consequently, never get a good sleep on a Sunday night again.

A couple of years later Michael Kennedy became my boss and I quickly learned that the basic five or six arguments we always used when negotiating film became a lot more interesting when they were injected with four letter words... many four letter words.

In 2005 I thankfully rode Michael's coattails over to the newly dominant Cineplex Entertainment. For the next eight years I'd like to say I helped contribute to Cineplex's success in becoming the market leader it is today.

In the spring of 2013 I was presented with an opportunity that I simply could not pass up... the chance to become the VP/GM of Universal Canada. I have truly enjoyed my time there ever since... once I got over the awkwardness of negotiating against the very people I had been in the trenches with for so long. So, now I work the other side of those same five or six arguments, although I have never really mastered the art of the four letter words. I am honoured to have the opportunity to work under great leaders in Nick Carpou and Jim Orr. Their stellar understanding of the Canadian market has certainly helped my transition and success in the role.

My introduction to the Canadian Picture Pioneers came very early in my career as my colleague and friend Ellie Munro was quite involved with the organization. In those days you were required to have 10 years of industry experience before you could join the organization, but that did not stop me from attending all the events and meeting new people. In my early

years as a film booker I was even 'lucky' enough to have the great Doris Payne donate \$20 to throw a cream pie in my face at the annual picnic day.

Attending all those events over the years introduced me to the fine charity work the Pioneers actually accomplish – raising money to discreetly help those in our industry community who need it the most. In 2013 I was presented with the opportunity to more directly contribute to the organization, joining the Board of Directors as Treasurer/Secretary. I could not be more proud to serve with the other members of our working Board under the leadership of Phil May and with the help of the underappreciated John Freeborn.

Congratulations to my fellow Spotlight honorees Karen Hansen, Michael Stewart, and Barry Newstead, and my good friend John Pederson for his well-deserved award of Pioneer of the Year.

I am very honoured to be a part of the Canadian Picture Pioneers and to spend my career in this wacky Canadian film industry. I look forward to continuing to be a part of it for many years to come. Thank you very much for this award tonight – it is truly an honour to accept.

People always ask me when, why and how did you become interested in film. They always think we have the coolest jobs. They haven't met Michael Kennedy.

The story I tell is when I was 12 years old, my father, who owned a retail business, dropped me off every Saturday morning at Synagogue. What I used to do was wave goodbye to him, go in the front door of the Synagogue and slip out the side door to go to the 10am matinee. This lasted 6 weeks until the Rabbi called my Dad and asked why I wasn't attending services. The end of my movie career.

In 1971, attended the very first film school in Pretoria, South Africa.

After 2 years of working on film and finding how difficult it was for full time work, I decided to find something more concrete and looked into distribution. Unable to find a job in distribution in South Africa and on a whim and borrowed

money travelled to England to try my luck there.

After pounding the pavement and knocking on doors, I ended up getting a job with Cinema International Corporation (A joint venture between Paramount, Universal and MGM). I was fortunate enough for them to obtain my working papers and started in the booking department. I was eventually promoted to an old fashioned salesman travelling around to small towns and selling film to independent theatres.

During my stay in London I met two Canadian doctors on sabbatical who kept telling me stories of Toronto and that, that would be the place for me to live.

I visited them in the fall of '74. Typical Canadian cold, wet, windy, miserable fall week and after the first three days I wondered why would I want to live here instead of London.

The second week was an

Indian summer and I thought this place isn't that bad and once again hit the sidewalk to meet some companies and was offered a job with United Artists.

Four months later I was back in Canada with a full resident visa and learning a new market. After two years, United Artists sent me to Calgary as the Calgary branch manager.

I spent three years there when my boss from Toronto told me he was leaving to open Orion Pictures and wanted me to move back to Toronto as the branch manager, so back to Toronto and after a year and a half took over as head of Orion Pictures in Canada.

In 1989 when things started to change at Orion and for personal reasons, I moved back to Calgary and worked as a consultant to a local distributor and did other odd jobs selling clothes.

In 1991 was offered a job at 20th Century Fox in Toronto as a salesman, returned to Toronto

and worked for one tough boss for 4 years. Those weren't fun years. Then a lady named Doris Payne came in as the head of Fox and things changed in a very positive manner for me.

In 2000 Doris left and returned to the States and thanks to Doris, I was given the role of General Sales Manager for Fox Canada.

Most of the people in our office have been together since my career with the company and it is not too often that one can work for such a long time with the same people. At Fox, we have a saying that we are part of the Fox family and I can certainly say that for our Toronto office.

I am blessed to have a wonderful wife, Andrea, two lovely daughters and a stepson, plus recently, our adorable granddaughter.

I have now lived in Canada longer than I lived in South Africa and I can say I am a proud Canadian.

Frank

KETTNER

IN MEMORY BIO 1929 - 2017



Frank Kettner was a fixture in the Canadian motion picture business for over fifty years. In 1951, together with partner Hector Ross, Frank formed a motion picture buying and booking agency, Theatre Agencies, that acted on behalf of independent theatre owners throughout Western Canada, Western Ontario, the Yukon and the Northwest Territories. The business expanded when they partnered with Doug Isman, of West-coast Theatre Services in Vancouver and Barry Myers, of Prairie Allied Booking Services, Winnipeg. Encouraged by early successes, Frank and Hector broke into exhibition, starting out with Calgary's Towne Cinema in 1965. Together with brothers Phil and Chuck May, the partners gradually expanded into small towns and bigger markets throughout Western Canada. That theatre chain became Landmark Cinemas of Canada. Over the years, Landmark embraced every mode of exhibition, from 15 drive-ins to art houses to single screens to megaplexes. By 2005, when Frank sold his interest in the circuit to private equity firms Manvest Inc. and Polar Capital, Landmark Cinemas had become the third largest chain in Canada with 134 screens in Alberta, British Columbia, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and the Yukon Territory.

Frank and Hector's success extended into the film distribution business. They formed Roke Distributors and Roke Entertainment Group, becoming for many years the exclusive Western Canadian sub-distributor for Walt Disney, Touchstone and Hollywood Pictures. Together they also formed Canfilm Screen Services, which bought, booked and distributed 16 mm film and projection equipment throughout Western Canada and the Northern Territories.

Frank's passionate commitment to the business led him to serve as President of the Motion Picture Theatre Association of Canada for six years. His contribution to the Industry saw Frank recognized as "Honoree of the Year" by the Alberta Motion Picture Theatre Association at their 57th Annual General Meeting in Banff in 2003. In 2013 Frank was honoured by the Canadian Picture Pioneers with a Diamond Spotlight Award. Together with his wife Sophie (who passed away in 2010) Frank has been honoured countless times for his service to Jewish causes. He served in the Israeli Army, was President of the Calgary Hebrew School, President of the B'nai Brith, led many community missions to Israel, and has been honored by the Jewish National Fund. Frank has two children, Carla and Eric, and two granddaughters, Remy and Sasha.

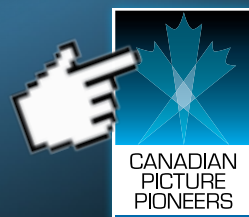
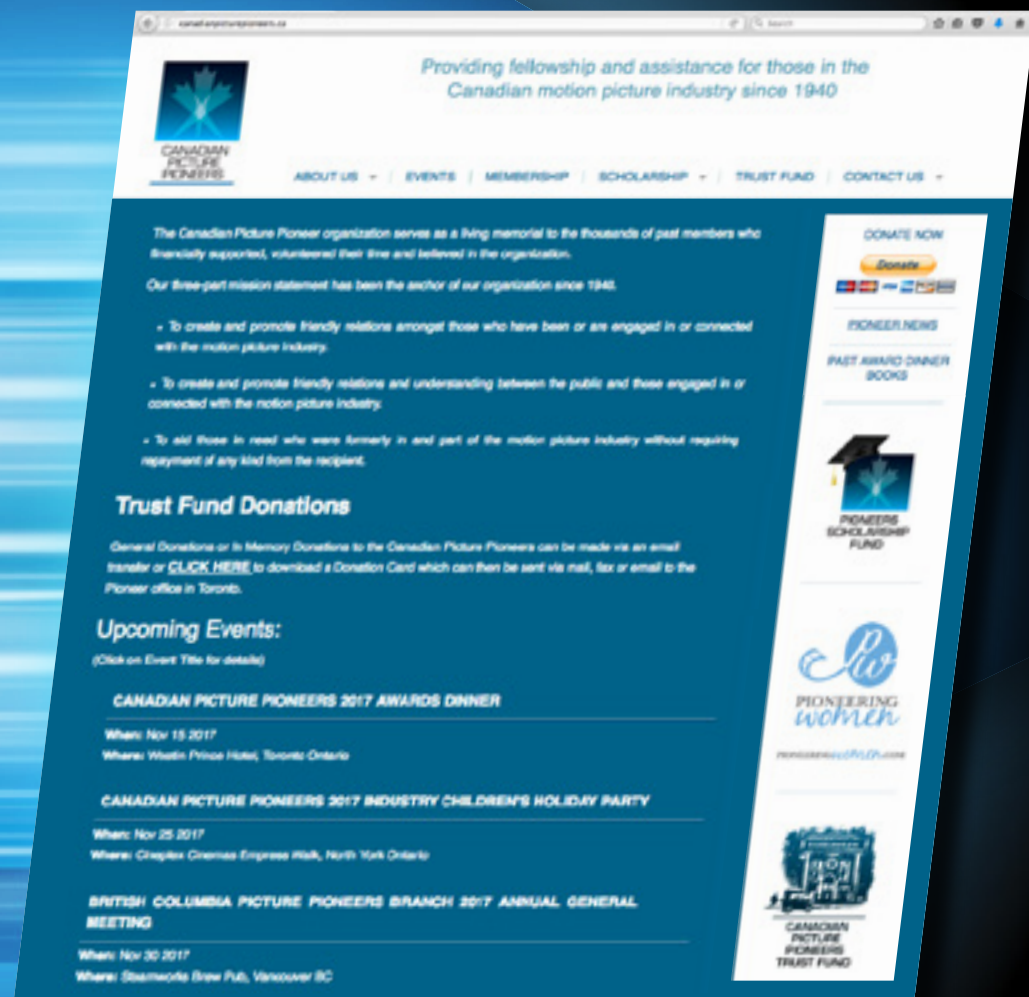

CANADIAN PICTURE PIONEERS TRUST FUND

It was the year “Gone with the Wind”, “The Wizard of Oz”, “Mr. Smith Goes to Washington”, “Stagecoach” and “Gunga Din” opened in theatres.

In 1939 a group of movie industry executives gathered to remember the passing of a friend. Jack Cohn, one of the founding partners of Columbia Pictures, was concerned that it only seemed to be funerals that brought industry friends together. Motivated by this thought, Cohn and a group of industry peers started the Picture Pioneers Inc., an organization to bring people in the industry together for fellowship and friends willing to help each other out in time of need. In the beginning membership was restricted to only those who had been in the industry for 25 years.

Many of the original members had help to start the major studios in Hollywood. In the first year over 200 other industry members joined, including some Canadians, among them pioneer theatre exhibitor Oscar Hanson and John Fitzgibbons, who later became president of Famous Players. These men brought together their friends Clair Hague and Ray Lewis to work on forming a Canadian equivalent and by the end of 1940 ratified a charter forming The Canadian Picture Pioneers. In the beginning years, it became obvious that the need for help would increase beyond what had been first contemplated, and

that formal fundraising plans would have to be developed to meet such demands. An important first step in those plans would be to apply to the Canadian Income Tax Department to register what would become the Canadian Picture Pioneers Trust Fund as a qualified charity with the right to issue receipts for income tax purposes.

It took until 1947, but this all came together with the Trust Document that we still operate under today stating that; “The Canadian Picture Pioneers Trust Fund shall be used and operated exclusively as a charitable fund and not for the benefit or private gain or profit of any persons, or of the Pioneers and shall be used solely for the relief of needy, poor or indigent persons generally throughout Canada and more particularly for the relief of any needy, poor or indigent persons who have been or are employed or were a part of the motion picture industry, or any affiliated industry.” From the beginning the Trustees struggled to build up a sustaining capital fund.

Each year, little by little, with the generous support of Pioneer members and supporting companies the fund has grown but the Pioneers still need your assistance. Please remember to donate to the Picture Pioneers with regular annual contributions, in memory donations and planned giving through insurance and estate planning.
